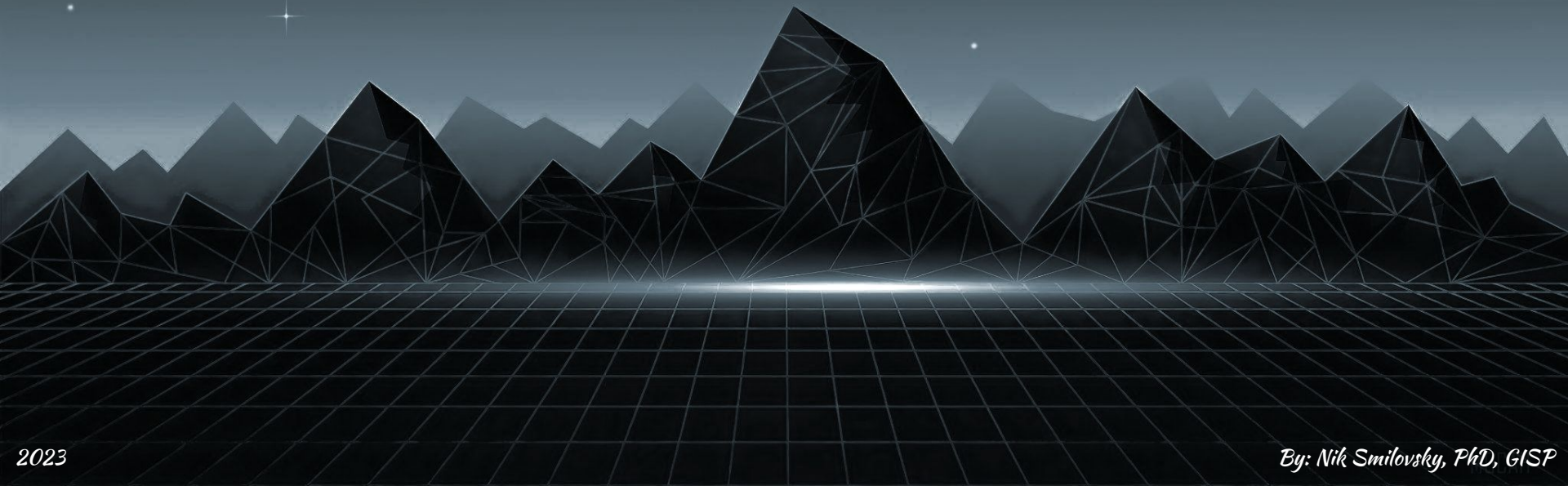

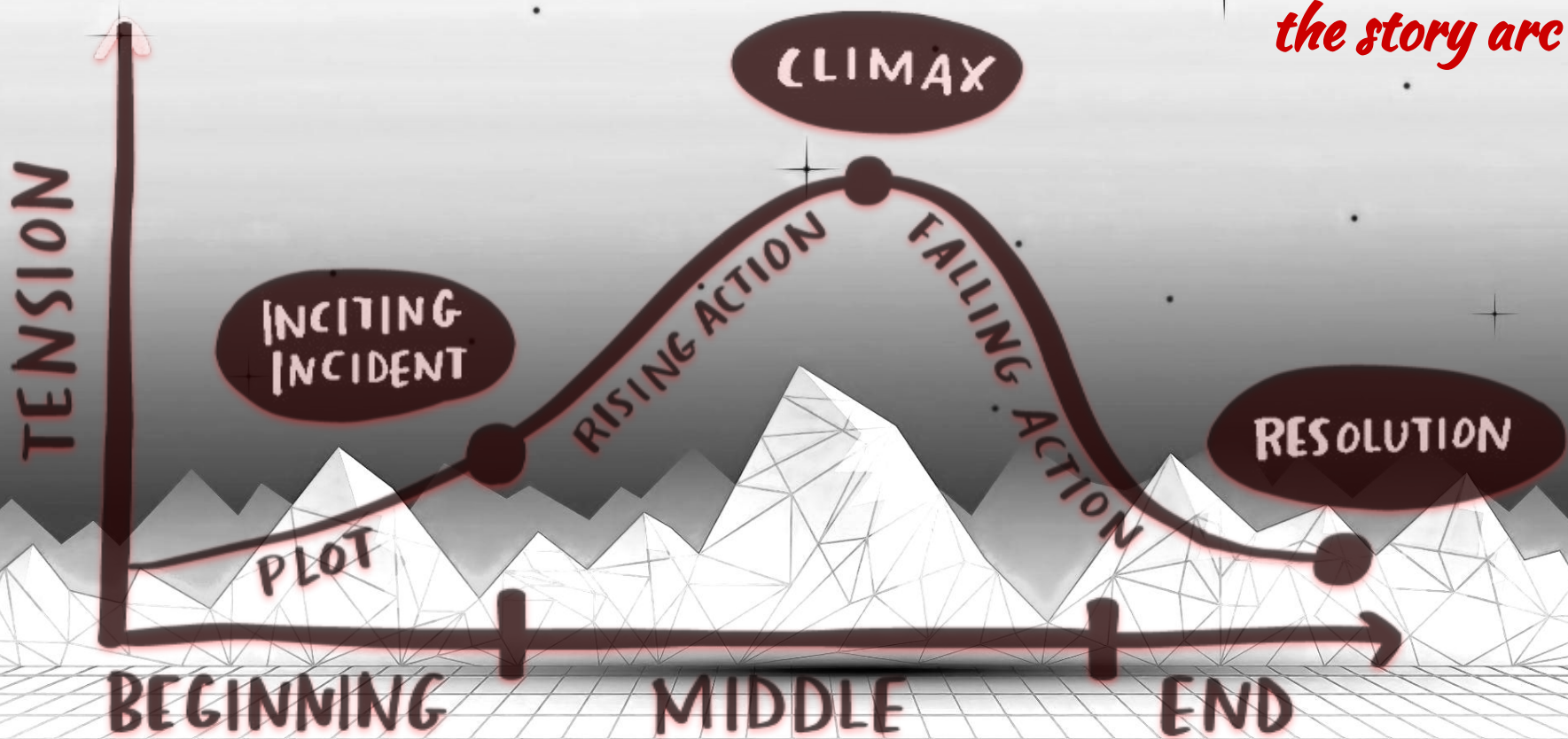

A **map** is a [symbolic](#) depiction emphasizing relationships between elements of some space, such as [objects](#), [regions](#), or themes.

Many maps are static, fixed to [paper](#) or some other durable medium, while others are dynamic or interactive. Although most commonly used to depict [geography](#), maps may represent any [space](#), real or fictional, without regard to [context](#) or [scale](#), such as in [brain mapping](#), [DNA mapping](#), or computer network topology mapping. The space being mapped may be two dimensional, such as the surface of the earth, three dimensional, such as the interior of the earth, or even more abstract spaces of any dimension, such as arise in modeling phenomena having many independent variables.

Although the earliest maps known are of the heavens, geographic maps of territory have a very long tradition and exist from ancient times. The word "map" comes from the [medieval Latin](#): *Mappa mundi*, wherein *mappa* meant 'napkin' or 'cloth' and *mundi* 'the world'. Thus, "map" became a shortened term referring to a two-dimensional representation of the surface of the world.

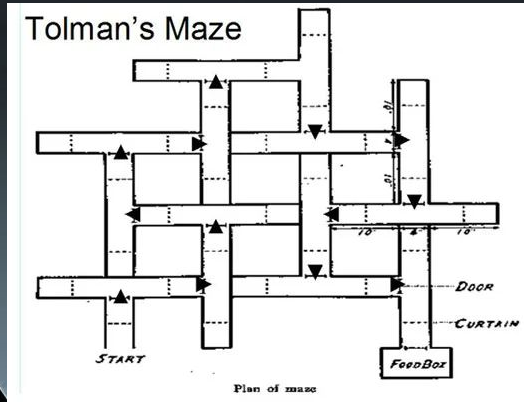
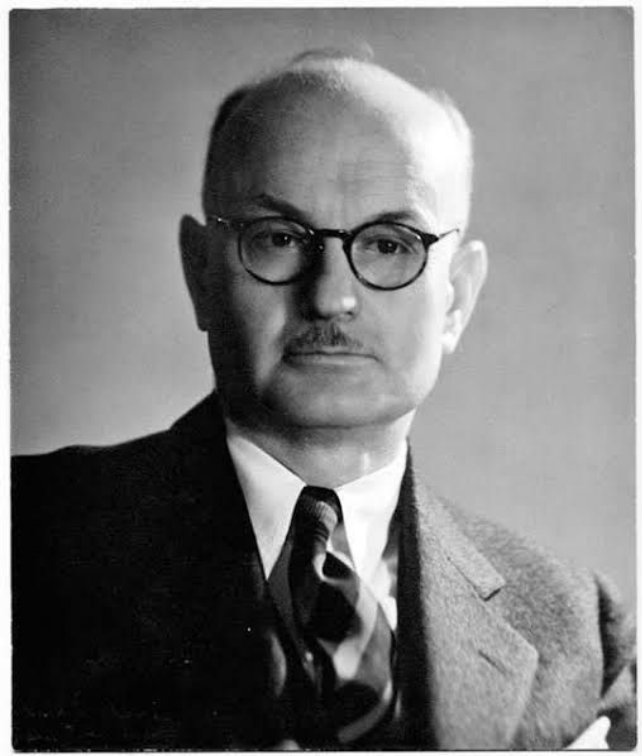

Cartography (/kɑːrˈtɒɡrəfi/; from **Ancient Greek**: χάρτης *chartēs*, "papyrus, sheet of paper, map"; and γράφειν *graphein*, "write") is the study and practice of making and using **maps**. Combining **science**, **aesthetics** and technique, cartography builds on the premise that reality (or an imagined reality) can be modeled in ways that communicate spatial information effectively.

Dressée par M. Minard, Inspecteur Général des Ponts et Chaussées au Ministère de Paris, le 20 Novembre 1869.

Les nombres d'hommes présents sont représentés par les largeurs des zones colorées à raison d'un millimètre pour dix mille hommes; ils sont de plus écrits en travers des zones. Le rouge désigne les hommes qui ont été en Russie, le noir ceux qui en sont sortis. — Les renseignements qui ont servi à dresser la carte ont été puisés dans les ouvrages de M. M. Thiers, de Légar, de Fezensac, de Chambray et le journal inédit de Jacob, pharmacien de l'Armée depuis le 28 Octobre.

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The history of the Bay of Islands

New Zealand's history is the history of many peoples living together, at peace and at war.

The Bay of Islands was the first part of New Zealand to be settled by Europeans. It has played a central role in the relationship between these foreigners and the native Māori to this day.



Ngāpuhi Heartland
The Bay of Islands is the center of the Ngāpuhi Māori iwi (nation or tribe). Today, it is the largest Māori iwi with over 125,000 members.

The Māori chief Ruatara, hosted the first Christian missionaries at Rangihoua Pā.

The Treaty of Waitangi
The 1840 Treaty of Waitangi between the United Kingdom and several hundred Māori chiefs made New Zealand a British colony in exchange for guaranteeing Māori rights. Despite this, it was often violated by later settlers.

The Flagstaff War
On 8th July 1845 the Māori leader Te Harau chopped down the British flag at Flagstaff Hill, starting the First Māori War.

Fortress Islands
Māori groups built fortified villages, or pā to protect from attack. Many pā were built to withstand British attacks during the colonial wars.

Whaling the South Seas
Whaling was an important part of the 19th century New Zealand economy. The Bay of Islands was a stopping point for whaling ships. Whalers had a rough reputation. When Charles Darwin visited here, he named one town (Russell) the "Hellhole of the Pacific".
